Some key points:

- -Adult supervision is important
- -Stay Away From Edges (S.A.F.E)
- -Rules for beach safety, flag meanings and potential danger of waves/currents.
- -Never go into water (rivers, the sea etc.) after footballs, toys or objects.
 - -No rough play in water.
- -Don't go out of your depth. Know your limits.

- -Remember the safe cross code. Use traffic lights and zebra crossings to cross the roads in towns.
- -Be aware. For example, don't wear headphones while cycling. Listen for approaching traffic.
- -Always wear a seatbelt.
- -The road is not a place for games. e.g. don't blindly chase after a ball if it goes onto the road.
